**Special considerations:** All participants must meet eligibility requirements as established by the South Dakota High School Activities Association and are required to have a physical examination on file with the school.

**Months/Dates/Times the activity takes place:**

Practice will take place July through September

Fall Season - August through November

Winter Season - November through March

**Maximum number of participants:**

Sophomore squad: 10 sophomores

Varsity squads: Combination of Juniors and Seniors

Football - 8      Basketball - 6 each      Wrestling - 5

**How membership/participation is determined:** Recommendation from faculty, interview and tryouts required

**Special restrictions:** A cheerleader may not participate in another sport during her designated cheer season

**Any costs associated with the activity:** Camp - \$60-120  
Uniform components - approximately \$200

**Special considerations:** All cheerleaders must meet eligibility requirements as established by the SDHSAA and are required to have a physical examination on file with the school. Cheerleaders spend much time decorating the school and lockers as well as other activities determined by the squad. These are mostly evening activities. **Months/Dates/Times the activity takes place:** Throughout the year students plan and participate in various activities that enliven the O’Gorman faith community through prayer, learning, and service. Habitat for Humanity, Empty Bowls, the Banquet, food and clothing drives, and a focus on various life issues are just some examples of the many different activities.

**Maximum number of participants:** All students are invited and encouraged to participate

**Special restrictions:** None

**Special considerations:** Ministry activities are coordinated by the Campus Ministry Team. Students from all grades are invited to apply and interview for the campus ministry team.

**Special restrictions:** This activity is mainly for advanced students and/or students who have a high aptitude in speech.

**Any costs associated with activity:** Students are responsible for all food expenses while traveling with the team. Other costs may be incurred in buying supplies and incidental travel costs.

**Special considerations:** Some school is missed due to overnight travel. Many competitions occur on the week end. Considerable time is spent on researching topics and preparations.

**Months/Dates/Times the activity takes place:** Three contests in March & April

**Maximum number of participants:** No maximum

**How membership/participation is determined:** Anyone can participate who is interested in debating and discussing mock legislation.

**Special restrictions:** N/A

**Any costs associated with activity:** Students are responsible for all food expenses while traveling with this activity.

**Special considerations:** Some school is missed due to overnight travel. Many competitions occur on the week end. Considerable time is spent on researching topics and preparation.

**Months/Dates/Times the activity takes place:** Rehearsals are held during the months of September and October. Performance dates are usually in the middle to the end of October.

**Maximum number of participants:** The cast consists of ten to twenty depending on the chosen production.

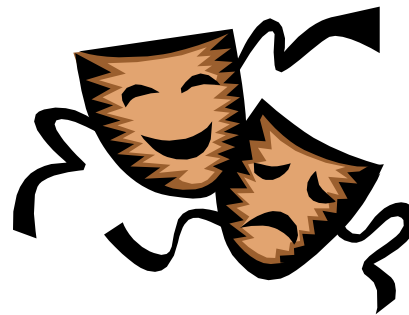
**How membership/participation is determined:** Auditions include improvisation, group activities, prepared readings, and storytelling.

**Special restrictions:** Schedule conflicts for students in other fall activities may prevent participation.

**Any costs associated with activity:** Some characters are asked to bring their own costume pieces.

**Special considerations:** Weekend practices are possible.

**Additional Involvement:** Students also have the opportunity to be involved with the technical aspect (set construction, lighting, sound, and costuming.) Tech size consists of 30-40 students.



**Activity Name:** Children's Play

**Months/Dates/Times the activity takes place:** Auditions take place at the end of October or beginning of November. Performance dates are in December.

**Maximum number of participants:** Cast consists of twenty to forty. Students with little stage experience are encouraged to audition. Some experienced actors take more directional roles.

**How membership/participation is determined:** Auditions include improvisation, group activities, and storytelling.

**Special restrictions:** Schedule conflicts for students in other activities may prevent participation.

**Any costs associated with activity:** Some characters are asked to bring their own costume pieces.

**Special considerations:** Weekend practice are possible

**Additional Involvement:** Students also have the opportunity to be involved with the technical aspect (set construction, lighting, sound, and costuming.) Tech size consists of 30-40 students.

**How membership/participation is determined:** The audition process takes two days. Day one is singing - day two is dry reading and choreography.

**Special considerations:** Students can also be involved in the technical crews for most drama productions previously described. Possible duties include lighting, sound, set construction, and other related duties.

**Special restrictions:** Prefer students with strong writing background. Photography skills helpful. All staff members must have access to a digital camera.

**Months/Dates/Times the activity takes place:** Early January - College Financial Aid officer attends to explain Federal Financial Aid and applicable forms.

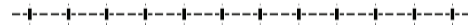

**Months/Dates/Times the activity takes place:** August - October. Practice daily at 7:00 a.m.; practice Tuesdays - Thursdays 3:15 - 5:00 p.m. Perform at home football games and competitions on Saturdays as part of the marching band.

**Maximum number of participants:** 24

**How membership/participation is determined:** Must be a member of the band.

**Special restrictions:** None

**Any costs associated with activity:** Purchase of shoes, sweatshirt, tights

**Special considerations:** Commitment to performances and practice are necessary.

**Activity Name:** Chamber Choir

**Director:** Mrs. Cathy Britton

Chamber Choir meets every day opposite the student's lunch period for a full year. Performance for the community takes place in the evenings during the school year. Student's can be asked to perform during the day for community events but it is a rare occurrence. This group sings a wide variety of literature from vocal jazz, classical literature to madrigals.

**Maximum number of participants:** 16 singers

**How membership is determined:** Students must be a member of a large chorus to participate in chamber choir. Students in grades 11 – 12 are eligible to audition. Auditions take place in Feb./March for participation in the following school year.

**Special restrictions:** N/A

**Any cost associated with activity:** \$50.00 costume rental fee. There are fundraising opportunities to help defray cost.

Special considerations: N/A

**Activity Name:** Ovation! Show Choir

**Supervisor/Director/Coach Name:** Cathy Britton

**Months/Dates/Times the activity takes place:** Ovation meets every day opposite the students lunch period. Performances for the community take place in the evenings during the school year. During competition season, students will rehearse one evening a week. There are week end retreats twice a year to learn choreography. Ovation is actively involved in regional show choir competitions during February, March, and April.

**Maximum number of participants:** 36 students

**How membership/participation is determined:** Students must be a member of a large chorus to participate in show choir. Students in grades 9, (men only), 10, 11, 12 are eligible to audition for Ovation. Auditions take place in March for participation the following year.

**Special restrictions:** N/A

**Any cost associated with activity:** \$75.00 costume rental and prop fee. There are several fundraising opportunities to help defray costs.

**Special conditions:** Students will have to commit to participation to five major competitions during March and April each year.

**Supervisor/Director/Coach Name:** Randi Wallenberg, ( Cathy Britton)

**Months/Dates/Times the activity takes place:** KnightLights meet every day opposite the students lunch period. Performances for the community take place in the evenings during the school year. KnightLights will compete in four show choir competitions during March and April.

**Maximum number of participants:** 36 students

**How membership/participation is determined:** Students must be a member of a large chorus to participate in show choir. Students in grades 9-12 are eligible to audition. Auditions take place in March for participation in the following year.

**Special restrictions:** N/A

**Any cost associated with activity:** \$75.00 costume rental and prop fee. There are several fundraising opportunities to help defray cost.

**Special considerations:** Students will have to commit to participation in four major competitions during March and April each year.

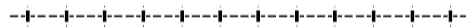
